

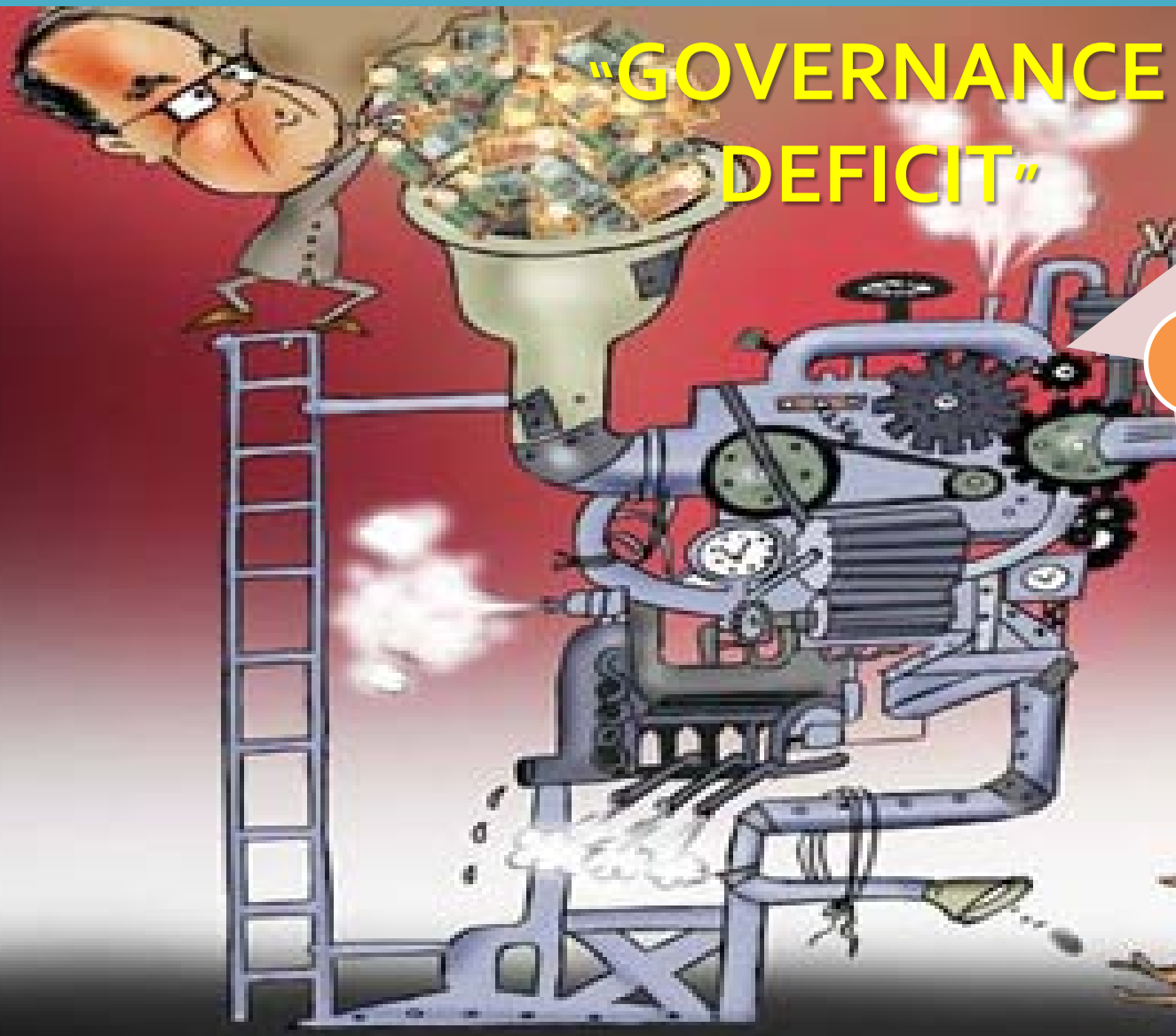

“GOVERNANCE DEFICIT”



Goal: Increased participation of children, parents and guardians in school affairs and management for equitable access to quality education

It includes:

- Supporting children, school administration & parents to improve school governance
- Capacity building for Districts, SMCs, PTAs & CCs
- Peer mediation
- Engaging & influencing interactions between actors
- ICT4D to mobilize participation and influence support mentorship.

Peer Mediation in Uganda



Inception:

- Study trip to Finland by the Director Basic and Secondary Education Ministry of Education

Capacity building:

- Training of the District Education Officers along with the Core Primary Teacher College tutors on the concept
- Capacity building for the trained to be trainers of the children and teachers
- Documentation on practice

Coverage:

Now in 175 primary schools in Uganda, 2(two) national Primary Teacher College and 25 secondary schools in Luweero district.

Peer mediators in the country:

8 Plan International Uganda staff as Trainers of Teacher trainers, 42 District staff as trainers of Teachers trainers, Peer mediation trainers 92, 155 teachers trained on peer mediation, and 326 peer mediators
