## PROJECT SUMMARY

The European Forum for Restorative Justice (EFRJ) is a Belgian NGO based in Leuven that has been working over the last fifteen years to promote mediation and other restorative oriented practices as alternative ways to overcome conflicts. The EFRJ has extensive experience in carrying out international research projects and organising events targeting mainly practitioners and it has now decided to organise a training course (TC) under the Erasmus Plus programme targeting mainly youth and social workers to increase the overall social impact and benefits of RJ practices.

Participants of the TC **RESTORATIVE ME** (October 2016) are youth and social workers from Belgium, Croatia, FYOM, Italy, Latvia, Romania and Spain (aged 22-30) involved in peace building, promotion of non-violent dialogue, social justice, communication and human rights.

**RESTORATIVE ME** will provide participants with strategies, methodologies and tools of work typical of mediators stimulating therefore constructive communication, emphatic dialogue and acceptance of different points of view and positions as a resource. Skills and expertise of the trainers will provide a unique opportunity for participants to broaden their knowledge of restorative justice practices and principles through a variety of non-formal education techniques. Additionally, the foreseen formative visits to the Katholieke Universiteit, the Secretariat of the EFRJ and a local organisation engaged in mediation will explain why Leuven is one of the most important centre for the development of RJ in Europe.

By organising this TC, the EFRJ and its partners hope to strengthening international cooperation and empowering youth workers with skills and competences inspired by restorative approaches. In turn, these skills could improve the ability of the young workers to better understand the needs of the different parties involved thus overcoming conflicts in a more participatory way.



There are many airports in Belgium: find out the most convenient for you by clicking on their website. Please find below the suggested itinerary from each airport mentioned in the map:

1) **ANTWERP**: Bus 51, 52 or 53 brings you from Antwerp Airport to Antwerpen-Berchem railway station in 10 minutes where you can take bus 21 and 32 or tram 9 and 11 to Rooseveltplaats (Roosevelt Square), near Antwerpen-Centraal railway station (then the train to Leuven).

2) BRUSSEL SOUTH/CHARLEROI: you can take one of the <u>Brussel City Shuttle</u> (every 30min) to <u>Brussel Midi</u> Station (45 -60 min). From Brussel Midi you can catch the first train to Leuven.
!!!!TIP!!!!!: Book online your bus return-ticket at the <u>Brussel City Shuttle website</u>.

3) **BRUSSEL INTERNATIONAL (Zaventem**): From the arrival floor of the airport, you can go to the underground train station and take the first train to Leuven (special fee "DIABLO" apply).

4) **LIEGE**: TEC BUS 53 to the main train station Liège Guillemins and then the train to Leuven.

### HOW TO REACH THE HOSTEL

Once you get off the train, please use the underpass toward Kessel-Lo and you will find the hostel on your left when outside (no more than 3 minutes walking distance from the platforms).

The De Blauwput Hostel is a modern building with conference rooms on the ground floor. Participants will have **free Wifi** in the lobby, lounge ,bar and conference rooms (not guaranteed in all rooms).

Based on the final number of participants, we will try to have separate dormitories for male/ female guests, but some mixed dormitory arrangements might be possible.
